

For this reason | remind you to rekindle the gift of God that is within you through the laying on of my hands; for God did not give us a spirit of cowardice, but rather a spirit of power and of love and of self discipline.

2 Timothy 1:5-7 from the lesson for October 2



As the apostle begins his letter to his friend and colleague Timothy in our second lesson for October 3, I am keenly aware of how he makes sure that Timothy is reminded how his faith came to him. First his grandmother Lois and then to his mother Eunice and then to him. I think that this is an excellent reminder for all of us. It

reminds us to be grateful to the ones who have nurtured us on our faith journeys and it reminds us that there are undoubtedly others who God wants to touch through our lives and witness.

For this reason, Paul exhorts Timothy to "rekindle the gift of God that is within you." What a fantastic image! Rekindling the gift of God that is within us. Is that not why we gather each Sunday (or Wednesday) around Word and sacrament? Is that not why we seek to continue to grow in faith throughout our lives? And the very fact that he uses the word "rekindle" indicates that everyone's faith, Paul's, Timothy's, mine and yours, needs to be renewed and revived on a regular basis. The word "rekindle" means to "set a fire burning again." That is what we are about!

Our faith makes a difference, not only in our own lives, but also in the lives of others. False humility and a lack of courage can lead us to try to keep our faith in Jesus hidden from others. However, Scripture proclaims that "God did <u>not</u> give us a spirit of cowardice, but rather a spirit of power and of love and of self-discipline." There is power in our witness and there is power in our love and there is power in our self-discipline. (We are after all, disciples!)

In September we started our Sunday School and confirmation ministries. Parents and grandparents and teachers will continue to rekindle their faith of our children. This month some of our own will affirm the promises of their baptisms. At that service I will lay my hands on their heads and pray, "Father in heaven, for Jesus' sake, stir up in ______ the gift of your Holy Spirit; confirm her faith, guide her life, empower her in her serving, give her patience in suffering, and bring her to everlasting life." If that is not rekindling, I don't know what is.

However, it is not just for those who are up front. It is for all of us. Each and every day we remember our baptisms and pray that God would confirm our faith, guide our lives, empower us in our serving, give us patience in suffering and bring us to everlasting life. God does these things not because of who we are but because of who God is.

Later in this same passage the apostle speaks of our relying on the power of God "who saved us and called us with a holy calling, not according to our works but according to his own purpose and grace." It is God who used others to nurture your faith and it is God who will use each of you to nurture the faith of others! Let us each give thanks for those who came before us and shared Jesus with us and let us give thanks for those whom our Lord will touch through our lives of service and witness.

Preschool Chatter




Thanks to everyone working together, making and stringing backpacks, bringing in supplies and packing the backpacks. One hundred sixty nine School Kits were delivered to the Lutheran World Relief warehouse in South Saint Paul. We started out having enough materials for 158 kits at the beginning of church on the day of assembly, but due to a last minute donation, a quick trip by one of the packers to the store for extra rulers, some additional bags coming in and some serendipity, the missing materials for 11 more kits showed up before the kits went up to LWR. New this year is the possibility that bar codes that were printed and attached to the 15 boxes of kits will allow us in 8 to 10 months to track where our kits go. By the time we fill kits next year, we may know where this year's went. Many thanks to all who participated!

- The fellowship hall will again be used to allow for extra spacing of items



Like the school kits, we hope that bar codes in the boxes will allow us to report by next summer where they went.

SINCE YOU ASKED...

What exactly is going to be different for worship on the first Sunday of each month?

Because right now we are worshipping together at one service at 9:30 am on Sunday mornings, we no longer have a second service that would utilize a nonliturgical format and people missed that service.

To try and provide a worship that didn't use the traditional hymns and liturgy with the kyrie, feast of victory, psalms and so on, our worship ministry team decided that on the first Sunday of each month we would sing songs that you might hear on a Christian radio station. Likewise, I would not use my vestments with an alb and stole, but wear a clerical shirt or shirt and tie to lead worship. We will also use the more contemporary version of the Lord's prayer and confession of faith.

One thing that does not ever change is that it will be a service where we gather to worship Jesus and receive God's grace through Word and sacrament.

If there are things that would make worship more meaningful for you, please let me or someone on our worship ministry team know. We are the church together!

COLUMBARIUM INFORMATION



A columbarium is a group of small compartments, or niches, designed to hold the cremated remains (cremains) of deceased loved ones. Each niche is identified by a granite faceplate inscribed with a person's name, birth date, and death date. The Columbarium will be located east of the church building along Pleasant Drive. Phase One will have 80 niches and includes a peace garden for visiting family and friends. Three additional phases of 80 niches each will take St. Philip's well into the future.

Eligibility

Church members, spouses or domestic partners, and family members, such as father, mother, brother sister, children, and grandchildren are eligible. Other individuals may be approved by the Columbarium Team.

3 Levels of Pricing

The pricing of the niches has been set at three levels, depending on location. All niches include two brass urns and engraving on the columbarium faceplate for up to two person's cremains. Engraving on the two brass urns is not included. Each niche is 12x12x12 inches. Urns other than those furnished may be used in the space allowed.

Niches in Row A and Row B are \$2,500 Niches in Row C and Row D are \$2,200 Niches in Row E are \$1,900







We are happy to be a part of St. Philip's, and are grateful for the friendly, welcoming people that make this church such a wonderful community of faith.




