



#### LET'S TALK ABOUT CELEBRATING FIRST COMMUNION!

Is your child asking about Holy Communion? Often children receive their first communion sometime between 1<sup>st</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> grade, but there is not a set age.



Every person grows in faith in different ways and at St. Philip's, parents take an active role in discerning when it would be best for their children to participate in this part of our life together.

There will be two classes for children and their parents on March 25 and April 1 from 9:00-11:00 am. During these times Pastor Geier will lead families in talking about the gift of Holy Communion and its place in our faith life. These classes are designed to be family time for all ages.

- Saturday, March 25, 9:00-11:00 am: Introduction – "A Place for You!"
- Saturday, April 1, 9:00-11:00 am: Closing and Banners
- Thursday, April 6, 7:00 pm: Maundy Thursday Worship with celebration of first communion

If you would like for your child or children to start receiving the sacrament but are able to participate in only one (or none) of the sessions, or will be unable to worship on Maundy Thursday, let me know so that we can make things work. If you have any other questions or concerns or would like to sign up for classes, please contact Pastor Geier at the church office.

and youth leaders to put on this event. Be sure to get these dates on your summer calendar and reach out to Becky Kaphing with any questions.


#### TIME AND TALENT

a fun night out as we'll have food and drinks for all. Watch newsletters and bulletins for more information in the coming weeks. Our tentative date is the evening of June 28.



#### **KEEPING CONNECTED**

Our story... Bernardo and I met in 1992 working

together in a restaurant in San Antonio, Texas. It was love at first sight. We were married within seven months and this August will celebrate 31 years of



marriage. We were pretty young so we waited a couple years before we started our family. Alex our oldest came December of 1994 and within two years we had Christina. We knew with a young family we wanted and needed family so we moved back to Minnesota in April of 1999. We chose Hastings because I had family here. My aunt and uncle were members of St. Philip's and so we decided to visit the church. We really fell in love with the St. Philip's family rather quickly. Our children have gone to Sunday school here, retreats and mission trips.

Back in November of 2006 we had a terrible house fire and lost everything. Unfortunately, we didn't have renter's insurance so we were left with nothing. Well a phone call was made and our church had donations waiting for us at my aunt's house that night. The next couple weeks the church took donations and then Thrivent matched a portion of it and gave us over \$6,000. We had been members for a little of 6 years but you would've thought we had been members since the beginning. I can honestly say between St. Philip's, Intek Plastics (where Bernardo use to work) and our school we made it past the fire and were able to rebuild. This type of generosity is never forgotten.

In 2014 we decided to open a restaurant in downtown Hastings. We have definitely had our ups and downs in our business but we are so proud to be a part of this community. In 2020 when COVID hit we decided it was time to pay it forward. Bernardo and myself fed lunches to nearly 4,500 kids out our back door. But it wasn't on our own, we had donations of milk, cookies, chips and money. Again this is the kind of community we are glad to be a part of. Bella will be graduating this summer and she will be the third through our great school system. Tony has a little over three years left of school. We aren't sure where life will take us after all our children are out of the house but I can say we have been blessed this far!
