Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood abide in me, and I in them. Just as the living Father sent me, and I live because of the Father, so whoever eats me will live because of me. This is the bread that came down from heaven, not like that which your ancestors ate, and they died. But the one who eats this bread will live forever."

He said these things while he was teaching in the synagogue at Capernaum. When many of his disciples heard it, they said, "This teaching is difficult; who can accept it?" But Jesus, being aware that his disciples were complaining about it, said to them, "Does this offend you?"

John 6:56-61

The really difficult part of our faith as followers of Christ lies in our coming to grips with the claims that Jesus makes about himself - his claims about how he not only points to God and God's love for us but that in him and through him the life that God wants to give us is conveyed to us.

There are many seekers after truth who recognize Jesus as a great teacher, even as a great miracle worker - but who cannot accept his claim - and the claim that the Apostles have ever made about him - that he is the way, the truth, and the life. As with many of those who had followed Jesus around the land of Israel and Palestine 2000 years ago, the statement made by Jesus in today's reading in which he claims to give life to us through his body and his blood - that body and that blood which we hold up to all every time we gather before this table - is too hard for them.

- Too hard for them to accept.
- · Too hard for them to believe.
- Too hard for them to commit themselves

And when we really look at some of the things that Jesus said, it is no wonder. "Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood abide in me and I in them. I can imagine Jesus asking me, "Does this offend you, Greg?"

Yes, it offends me. When I really think about it, it sounds like cannibalism. It feels bloodthirsty and unrefined. It brings things down to the level of flesh and blood, heat and flies buzzing, to reality. There is nothing dainty about what you are saying, Jesus.

This is especially true when we read the actual words you used. You did not just say the common words for eating but the word trogon which means to munch audibly or to gnaw like animals pulling meat of the bone. It is no wonder people stopped following you.

Why did you use THAT word, Jesus? I've seen documentaries of animals gnawing at their food. For them, when they eat that way, it is a matter of survival. They want every bit they can to sustain them. Is that the kind of hunger and mindset you want me to have? That I need this meal, your body and blood, to survive? It certainly makes me look at our refined wafers and individual sanitary cups in a different light.

Yes, your words offend me. They ask me to trust. They place me on a fence and say I must jump; I cannot stay there.

But....where can I go? You have the words of eternal life! Despite my reservations, my twentieth century hang-ups, my intellectual pride, I understand this one thing, it all comes down to trust, to faith, to belief. You, Lord, are the Holy One of God. Therefore, no matter how I may struggle with your "difficult" words, I will cling to them and eat and drink that I may abide with you forever.

Lutheran World Relief School Supply Drive



It's hard to believe, but the Back to School displays are up in the stores already and that means it is time to start collecting supplies for the Lutheran World Relief School Kits we will be packing on Rally Sunday, September 10! Each kit needs:

FOUR spiral notebooks of 70 pages of EITHER wide or narrow rule paper (45¢ at the local big box store) **ONE** pair blunt children's scissors (77¢, big box)

ONE 2.5" pink eraser (generic 2/47¢ big box)

ONE box 16 or 24 crayons, Crayola brand, please – they ship and work better and aren't that much more expensive than generics (boxes of 24 are 50¢ at the big box)

FIVE blue or black ball point pens (no gel ink!!!) 10/94¢ at the big box when in stock

ONE 30-centimeter ruler or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other (but none without centimeters! (wood ones 54¢ at the big box, plastic ones 3/\$1.25 at a dollar store)

ONE pencil sharpener (47¢ with shavings catcher at the big box)

FIVE UNSHARPENED #2 pencils (24/97¢ at the big box)

We filled 264 bags last year and for this year we just ordered 400 pre-made bags with a Thrivent grant and donations. Can we fill them all? If you would prefer that we shop for you, donation envelopes are in a plastic sleeve on the kiosk. Envelopes should be placed in the lock box outside the church office.

Complete the Dream Update

The "Complete the Dream" initiative to complete the intended construction of the southwest wing finished very successfully. The final result was \$165,750 which was pledged from 103 St. Philip's member households and friends of St. Philip's.

It's without pause, that we give thank God for the spirit of every donor who found it possible to participate with their financial resources. The endeavor was motivated by a pledge of \$80K toward the completion of the rooms intended in the 2013 expansion. In a six-week period an amount over the goal of \$130K was reached.

Construction will begin July 26, and is scheduled to be complete before mid-September.

The addition will provide offices for a pastor, treasurer, office manager, youth and family staff person, plus an ample work room. The existing offices will become a generous general purpose room, a conference room, and an office for a music staff person. Humble and grateful thanks to all who made this building improvement possible.

Preschool Playground Update

On July 5 the preschool got their new woodchips put into the playground. We would like to thank the congregation for their support. At this time, we have raised \$2,002.36 of the \$2,500 needed to fund this project. We did have to go ahead and get it done before the funds were fully raised because we needed to make sure we have the correct amount of woodchips that are required by state licensing.

Come join your St. Philip's family as we make a difference by packing meals for hungry neighbors around the world! Volunteering at Feed My Starving Children is a great team-building experience. Enjoy working together to save lives and feed kids in a positive, energetic and team-focused environment. This is a serving event for most everyone. (For safety reasons, children under the age of 5 are not allowed to be on the packing floor.)

There will be a sign-up sheet on the kiosk in the narthex for you, your family, and your friends. Thirty spots have been reserved for our group, but we can probably get more if we sign up early. We also will only be taking signups through Sunday, August 18, so if there are less than thirty we can let them know so that other groups may fill those spots.

FMSC also asks that we follow this student-to-adult ratio when registering to volunteer which should not be a problem:

- Grades K-2: 1 student to 1 adult
- Grades 3-6: 3 students to 1 adult
- Grades 7-12: 4 students to 1 adult

If you have already participated in a FMSC event, then you know how much fun it is. If you haven't done this yet, now is the time! Those who want to will meet at the church to form carpools and leave at 8:45 am. Otherwise plan on being at 990 Lone Oak Road, Suite 136 in Eagan by 9:15 am. Our slot to learn and work is from 9:30-11:15 am.
